# Treasurer's Report: Kara on behalf of Chiara

Our PandC Bank account remains stable, currently holding \$184,522.73, despite significant disbursements made to the school since our last meeting. We've already issued two cheques for square reimbursements as follows:

\$1,191.82 – Dance Show
\$869.39 – Big night out
This will result in a reduced cash availability of \$183,461.52.

Since the previous meeting, we've made the following payments:

Annual insurance renewal: \$1,479.00

Innerwest Music Festival reimbursement (received via square payment): \$1,891.85 Steam room equipment purchase: \$50,957 (A grant received from Jason Li) Movement Studio air conditioner grant from the Department of Industry via Sally Situ: \$6,700 (Special thanks to KT for organizing this grant and for coordinating this effort; the studio benefits from various uses, and the dancers greatly appreciated it) \$150 was allocated for food expenses to the hospitality team, during the Steam opening ceremony. Big thank you to the school for transferring \$24,711.50, representing P&C parents' contributions paid via school fees (very generous parents).

With today's votes, we will be able to pay for supplies and other expenses requested by each faculty.
